Commissioner McGrath

Commissioner McGrath is still working with Penrod to come coat the fence. They are behind and will come out when they can. The fence also needs to be dry before they can coat it. It might be the spring before it they can get it done.

He talked to Ken Abrams who owns the nursery. He recommends alternating trees with Robin Hill Serviceberry and Rising Sun Red Bud. Both of these trees are easy to grow and maintain. \$145 for Robin Hill Service Berry and \$125 for Rising Sun Red Bud. We need 16 trees total. Install would cost \$130 each. Total cost would be \$4,240. They can be installed 7 to 10 days after we make a decision.

Commissioner Danner made a motion to allocate funds from line 50165 – City – Capital Projects - in the amount NTE \$4,500 to replace the trees in the front island. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Quinn and passed unanimously.

He was notified by a resident that a light is out on Little Bend and Ash Ridge. He has contacted LG&E, but it has not been done yet.
