Mayor Franklin

Parks Board

Asked about the additional ARPA funds and how to use them. The commission mentioned that it can be used for roads because of how expensive roads are. Also asked if signage is needed for 'play at your own risk' as well as kids sledding down the hill into the park. Still looking to make some repairs on bridges and stairs. When the neighborhood cleared the path, cleared part that was not on Brownsboro Farm property. Reached out to let owners know and they seemed fine with it.
