FROM OUR MAYOR: Jimmy Stout

Just wanted to give everybody an update from the September commissioners meeting. We had several residents speak on the subject of safety. Most spoke in favor of speed bumps, some spoke against them. Several spoke in favor of speed detection devices that will light up when a vehicle is going over the speed limit. Lowering the speed limit in the city was also discussed. Several residents expressed concern that some of our traffic problems are due to cut-thru traffic due to the change in dismissal times at Norton Elementary. While Norton cut-through traffic does affect our city, usually from 4:15-4:45, the bulk of our problems come from our residents and their guests. I have reached out to Louisville Metro police to get their thoughts on solutions to our traffic issues. I have reached out to the mayor of Barbourmeade. I have not heard back from him. Police started patrolling around the school in the afternoon. Several tickets were written last Friday. We have contracted with Meadowvale police for an additional 20 hours of patrols over the next 30 days. 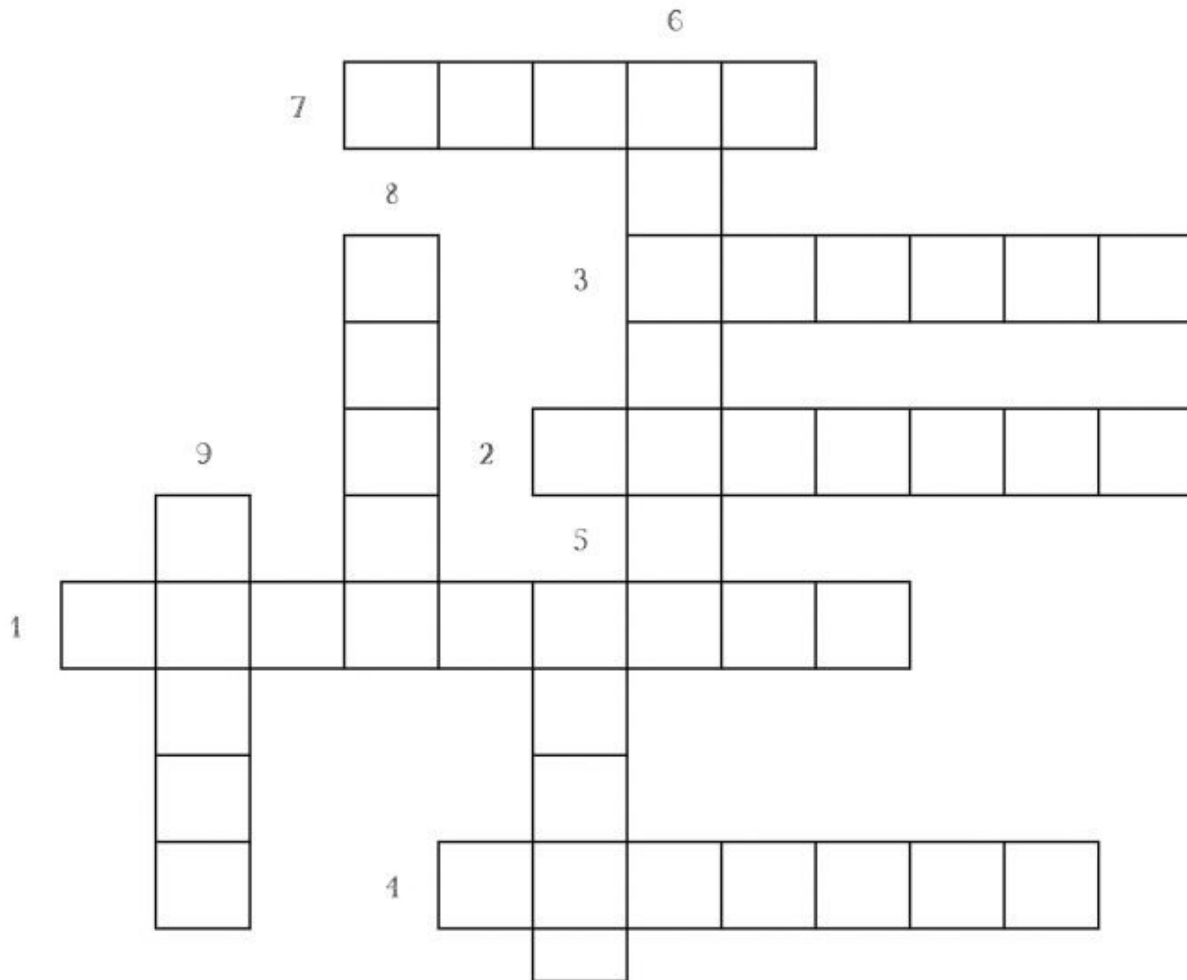


