Welcome to another exciting pool season! As summer begins, I am thrilled to welcome everyone back to one of our community's favorite gathering places. Whether you're swimming laps, relaxing poolside, or spending time with family and friends, we hope you have a safe, fun, and memorable summer at the Brownsboro Farm Pool.

Before we dive into the season (pun intended), I would like to extend a special thank you to Brian Durbin, our Pool Guy, and Ben Bartley for their hard work and dedication in helping prepare the pool for opening day. Their efforts have helped ensure that our pool is clean, safe, and ready for everyone to enjoy.

As we begin the season, please review the following reminders to help keep our pool safe, enjoyable, and in great condition all summer long:

- Children must be supervised by a parent or guardian at all times while at the pool.
- Only children age 11 and older are permitted to enter the pool deck without an adult.
- Children 11 and under may not attend the pool with only an older sibling. They must be accompanied by a parent, guardian, or approved supervisor.
- Teen supervisors or babysitters must be at least 14 years of age.
- Guests must wear their gray pool guest bands and must enter the pool with a pool member.
- Please sign in when entering the pool area.
- Keep the pool gate closed at all times for everyone's safety.
- When the lifeguards call "break," everyone must exit the pool until break time is over.
- No breakable cups, bottles, plates, bowls, or other containers made of glass, porcelain, ceramic, or similar materials are permitted inside the pool area.
- No pets are allowed inside the pool area.
- Parents, please supervise your young children when using the restroom facilities. We have experienced several instances of excessive toilet paper being placed in the toilets, which can lead to plumbing issues and facility closures. Your help in monitoring our youngest swimmers is greatly appreciated.
- Please clean up after yourselves before leaving so we can keep our pool looking great all summer long.

We are also excited to cheer on our very own Brownsboro Farm Marlins Swim Team! The Marlins will be hosting two home swim meets this summer. On meet days, the pool will close at 4:00 PM to allow time for setup. We encourage everyone to come out and support our swimmers as they represent Brownsboro Farm. Our concession stand will be open during the meets, so grab a snack and enjoy an evening of community fun while cheering on the Marlins!

Thank you for helping make our pool a wonderful place for neighbors to gather and create lasting summer memories. By following these guidelines and showing consideration for one another, we can ensure a safe, clean, and enjoyable pool season for everyone.

4th of July Brownsboro Farm Olympics

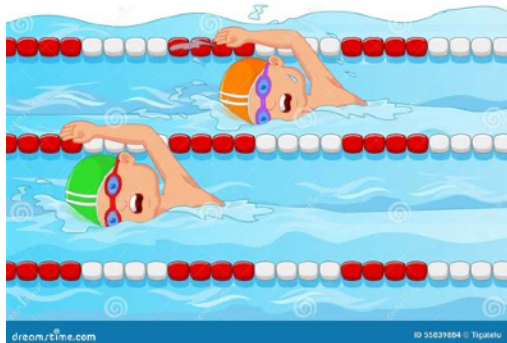
